This past Saturday, November 6th, a local family suffered devastating loss and trauma in a house fire on South Elm street. The community support for the Yang family has been very heartening to witness and we appreciate everyone who has donated to their gofundme campaign and helped in other ways.

As you know, there was another family in the adjacent house that were affected by the fire and in turn lost their homes. NECC has also been working to provide this family with clothing, food, and temporary shelter.
