PRAYER OF SELF-GIVING

SHARING THE MEAL

We celebrate an open communion, and welcome every person to the table. We share the bread and the cup in Jesus' name as a reenactment of an ancient vision of God's feast for all people. We don't require you to belong to this church, or any church, to participate with us in this feast of grace: all that is needed is that you desire God's nurture. Today we will receive communion seated in the pews: please serve your neighbor, and allow yourself to be served. We will hold the bread until all have been served and eat together, signifying our unity in Christ. (The bread is gluten-free, as we strive to welcome all to the table.) We will drink the cup as we receive it, signifying our personal relationship with Christ.

God of new beginnings, you draw near to us in word and sacrament to strengthen and renew us.

Kindle in us the fire of your Spirit.

May your light so shine through us that all may know we are living in the light of your promise.
