Snehalayam Orphanage, in Annamanada, India, is a group home meeting the needs of 22 boys. The non-profit strives to provide a homely environment, a basic education, and lots of love. Ashabhavan, also in Annamanada, India, is a group home and occupational school for 30 girls and young women. Roughly half of them are hearing impaired and participate in free vocational training including embroidery, jewelry making, and computer training. The other half have more severe cognitive and physical disabilities and require more complex individualized care.

IN OUR PRAYERS:
