CALL TO WORSHIP


ONE: This is a holy place: set apart by prayer to bring our fears, our hopes, our doubts, all the questions of our hearts.

CROP Hunger Walks are community-based fundraising events held in cities and towns across the United States, created to support the global mission of Church World Service, a faith-based organization transforming communities around the globe through just and sustainable responses to hunger, poverty, displacement, and disaster. After a CROP Hunger Walk ends, 25% of the funds raised is returned to the host community to support local hunger fighting efforts.

This year will be the 39th annual CROP Walk since Pastor Dick and Joanne Taber brought the event to Northwest Connecticut (and neighboring areas of Massachusetts and New York). In our congregation, Pastor John, Pat Palmer, and Joanne Taber are helping to organize the event — and we could use help **Arranging logistics, planning PR, managing social media, recruiting walkers, and making walks yourself:** there is something for everyone to do!
