CALL TO WORSHIP


ONE: We are people who have heard God's call to follow where God leads us.

We Feast at God's Table

PREPARATION

LEADER: We gather now as one body, joined around the table. **PEOPLE: Here we celebrate God's presence among us**

united in Christ's spirit, broken and whole all at once;

Nourished and hungry, loving and lonely, sinner and forgiven; we make one circle of knowing,

believing, rejoicing, being, as God lights and rests among us.

INVITATION

This is the table of the Heavenly Feast,

the joyful celebration of the saints of God.

Christ invites everyone to eat the bread of life,

THE MEAL

We serve gluten-free bread and grape juice, as we seek to welcome all to the table.
