ONE: If your clothes are fine and you have lots of gold rings, you're welcome here.


ALL: If your clothes are well-worn and you don't have a place to sleep, you're welcome here.

We Feast at God's Table

INVITATION

RESPONSIVE COMMUNION PRAYER

ONE: This is the joyful feast of the people of God.

ALL: Let us rejoice and be glad.

Creator God, we bless you and praise you: You spoke and the Earth was formed; You drew a breath and the sea rose.

All of creation sings your praises.

From the dust of the Earth, you created our bodies. You gave us our senses and blessed us with the powers of thought and compassion and love — yet often we have turned against you and one another.

Have mercy on us, Mighty God.

And so you sent us your son, our brother Jesus, to show us how to love you. He announced good news to the impoverished, release to the captives, sight to the blind, and freedom to the oppressed.

Through all his life and death, he reconciled us to you and to our brothers and sisters.

On the night he was arrested, in company with his good friends at the Passover meal, Jesus remembered your liberation of those who were in bondage. At that freedom feast Jesus took the bread, gave thanks to you, the source of all nourishment, and said,

"Take. Eat. This is my body, which is given for you.

Do this, remembering me."

After supper, he took a cup of wine and said,

"Drink this, all of you. This is the new covenant, sealed in my blood; whenever you drink it, do this, remembering me."

Remembering Jesus, we ask you to send the power of the Holy Spirit upon this bread and this cup, that these gifts may be for us the sacrament of your healing presence among us in a broken and bleeding world. Feed us with your power; fill us with your peace; lead us, reconciled and redeemed, into the world to work for the liberation and reconciliation of all peoples.

In the name of God — Creating, Redeeming, and Sanctifying — we pray: Amen.

We celebrate an open communion, welcoming every person to the table. We share the bread and the cup in Jesus' name as a reenactment of an ancient vision of God's feast for all people. We will hold the bread until all have been served and eat together, signifying our unity in Christ. We will drink the cup as we receive it, signifying our personal relationship with Christ. (The bread is gluten-free and the cup is non-alcoholic, as we strive to welcome all.)

ONE: Eternal and gracious One, though we live in a world of need,

ALL: here we have tasted your goodness and hungered for a world more just.

Though afflicted by brokenness and division,

here we have heard again your call to be a people of grace-filled community.

Though daily we touch our limits,

in faith, in hope, and in love. Amen.




